Class size

The Board of Education believes that appropriate class size is vital to the learning process, but there is no single number of students which is inherently right for all classes. The objectives of a particular course and the methods used in that program will determine class size.

The student-teacher ratio must be set at a level which permits the teacher to be attentive to individual differences.

Student-centered learning activities and a high degree of individualized attention to each student are high priorities in this school district. Accordingly, appropriate class size must always be determined according to the nature of the instruction, the academic ability of the students in the course, age of learner and any special educational needs of enrolled students. It is the curriculum and the methods of instruction to be employed that determine the appropriate size of any instructional grouping.
