

Students**Use of Beepers (Paging Devices), Laser Pointers and Cellular Telephones**

Except as allowed herein, students shall not possess or use a remotely activated paging device or a laser pointer device while on school property, or while attending a school sponsored activity on or off school property. The school principal may grant written permission for such possession and use of a paging device by a student if the student or his parent or guardian establishes to the satisfaction of the principal that a reasonable basis exists for the possession and use of the device.

A “paging device” is defined as a telecommunications device that emits an audible signal, vibrates, displays a message, or otherwise summons or delivers a communication to/or from the possessor. The use of cell phones during the academic day and/or school-sponsored activities disrupts and interferes with the educational process. Students may be subject to disciplinary procedures and confiscation of the device if it is either visible and/or used on school property, on school transportation, or while attending a school-sponsored activity on or off school property.

The administrator reserves the right to confiscate the device.
