Program Accessibility in Schools/Facilities

All school meetings, conferences, programs and activities are available, without discrimination, to individuals with disabilities as defined by the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and/or Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Whenever an individual with a disability wishes to attend or participate in a meeting, conference, program, or activity which is located in an inaccessible location, that meeting, conference, program, or activity will be relocated to an accessible area. Forty-eight hour notification of the need for relocation should be made by the individual with a disability (or their parent/guardian) by contacting the superintendent's office at 203-261-2513. The superintendent is responsible for implementing this policy by relocating meetings, conferences, programs, or activities.

Whenever an individual with a vision impairment seeks to obtain information under this procedure, the information will be communicated as follows: a Braille copy of the posting, a tape recording of the notice, and/or the use of a reader, where necessary, will be provided upon request.

Whenever an individual with a hearing impairment seeks to obtain information under this procedure, the information will be communicated as follows: an interpreter will provide assistance upon request. A TDD phone line may be accessed by dialing 1-800-842-9710 or 711.

This policy will be posted in prominent and, where possible, accessible places at all schools, as well as on the central office Web site at www.er9.org.

This policy will be included in any publication, notice, or announcement which describes meetings, conferences, programs, or activities (e.g. brochures, handouts, agendas, etc.) of the Easton, Redding and Region 9 School Districts.
